Rita and I have been re-reading the James Herriot books recently. As you may remember, they are collections of short stories written by a Yorkshire Veterinarian describing his experiences working in the Yorkshire Dales. Since we are having our annual *Blessing of the Pets* on Saturday, October 4<sup>th</sup> at 10:00, it seemed like a good time to share part of one of his stories.

Miss Stubbs was a very elderly woman, frail with age. 'Though she was physically limited, she still took great pleasure in her pets: three dogs and two cats. On one of Herriot's visits, she confided to him that she knew she didn't have long to live. That was all right, she said; she had had a good life and was unafraid—except for one thing. She said, almost in tears, that she was afraid she'd miss her pets.

"It's my dogs and cats, Mr. Herriot. I'm afraid I might never see them when I'm gone and it worries me so. You see, I know I'll be reunited with my parents and my brothers, but..."

"Well," replied Herriot, "Why not with your animals?"

"That's just it," she said, and there were tears on her cheeks. "They say animals have no souls."

"Who says?"

"Oh, I've read it and I know a lot of religious people believe it."

"Well, I don't believe it," said Herriot, "If having a soul means being able to feel love and loyalty and gratitude, then animals are better off than a lot of humans. You've nothing to worry about there."

"Oh, I hope you're right. Sometimes I lie at night thinking about it."

"I know I'm right, Miss Stubbs, and don't you argue with me. They teach us vets all about animals' souls."

The tension left her face, and she laughed with a return of her old spirit. "Be absolutely honest with me. What are your beliefs? Will my animals be with me? Is that what you really believe?"

"I do believe it," Herriot answered, "With all my heart I believe it."

**Feeding the Kids Program**

## **Library News at UMCB - UMW Reading Program**

The book, "Break the Cycle: Healing from an Abusive Relationship" by Tracy S. Deitz, is listed in the "Social Action" category. The author relates examples from the case history of a lady named Lydia who was able to leave her abusive spouse and rebuild her own life. Deitz divides her book into three sections: "Drowning", which entails trying to live with addictive behavior; "Swimming" in which the victim begins to withdraw from the abusive relationship; and "Safe on Shore," when the woman has established her own identity and has started to form new relationships. At the end of each section, there are questions designed to help readers reflect on their own feelings and evaluate their relationships in terms of emotional health. The author also provides a variety of resources from the Bible, literature, and organizations that may be helpful to anyone who is dealing with domestic violence.

## **WE FINALLY FINISHED IT!!**

Before 2008 the process of upgrading and replacing light fixtures with 4 foot long by 1-1/2 inch bulbs (T12) was started. The first were the replacement of incandescent fixtures with 4 foot long by 1 inch bulbs (T8) in the office hall, Parlor, Library, and Learning Center. When the renovation was started it was suggested that the fixtures in the Education wing should be replaced. The architect estimated that the cost would be \$130,000. The committee studied the fixtures which were from 1960, and found they were very solid and in good condition, and were lighting the rooms very well. It was decided that church members would strip out the wires, ballasts and bulbs and replace them with a T8 system. The estimated cost was \$4000. It took many hours and members of the congregation to complete the task in two years. It then became a natural quest to change all the T12 x 4 foot bulbs to the T8 system. This was finally completed Tuesday, September 9, 2014. Also all the new fixtures added of the long florescent type will be of the T8 style. HOORAY!!

**DID YOU KNOW UMCB HAS A CHILD PROTECTION POLICY?**

“... ‘Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it.’ And he took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.” (Mark 10:14b-16, NRSV)

The East Ohio Conference reminds us that our Lord placed sincere value on children and the example of faith they provide for us. He was also concerned about their vulnerability. The Social Principles of The United Methodist Church state that “children must be protected from economic, physical and sexual exploitation and abuse.”

The United Methodist Church of Berea has implemented a policy to protect children. First adopted by the Church Council in 1998, the Council updated it on August 26, 2014. The policy includes a definition of abuse, guidance for the supervision of children and youth, screening of volunteers, response of church workers to allegations of abuse, education of persons who work with children and youth, and cyber and general safety issues. In addition, the church is insured through Brotherhood Mutual in the event of a claim.

Each year Sunday School teachers attend an orientation in which the policy is reviewed. Moreover, anyone who works with children, both teachers and others, fill out a screening form for a background check. These measures are intended to prevent any problems.

*Monitoring your kid's apps, chat rooms and networks is essential...*

**1**

Get filtering software for all your home PCs and your kids' phones. Even so, check for suspicious apps and familiarize yourself with their icons.

**2**

If you find something, don't panic. Ask your child why she/he likes the app and whether they think it poses any risks. Don't interrupt - the more you listen, the more you'll learn.

**3**

When he/she's finished sharing, explain your objections to the app. Then watch him/her delete it.

**4**

Stay vigilant. Set up a family account for app downloads and keep the password secret so yours kids will have to tell you what they're downloading. Casually mention risky apps you've heard about (while in the car, during dinner, as you're watching TV), which lets them know you're aware of how teens are connecting with their peers.


