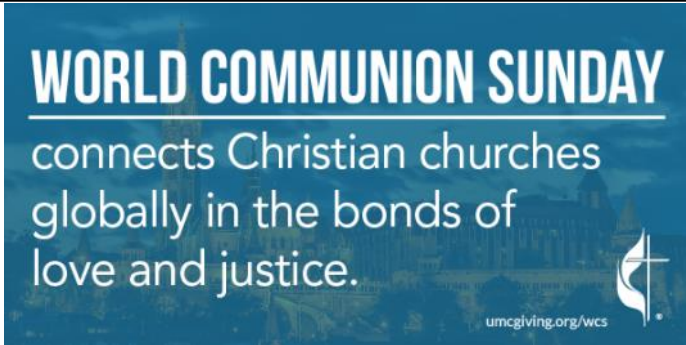

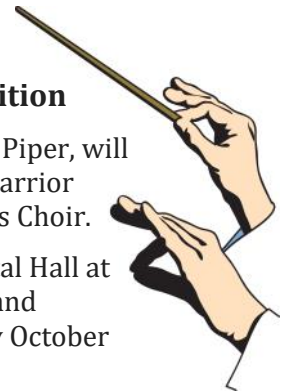

Our Christian Formation year is off to a great start!

Here is a recap of our offerings, and what is still open to those who are ready to take a leap of faith.

This fall, we present to you a new discipleship pathway, prayerfully and thoughtfully designed for our congregation by our Discipleship team. **A Disciple's Path** is intended as the first step and map for an ongoing discipleship pathway by which every person continually can grow in her or his relationship with God and the church. The goal is Christian formation, i.e. the gracious transformation of our lives into the image and likeness of Christ (Ephesians 4.13)

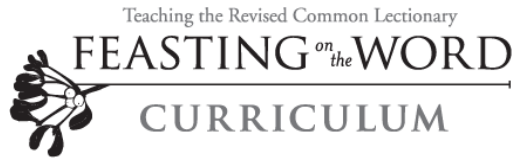

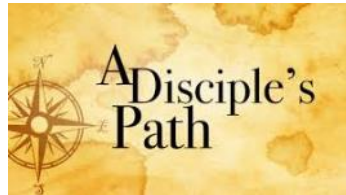

Whirl! Children preschool – 6th grade are exploring the same Bible stories as the adults in worship as they explore the lectionary. Children's Choir – Children are getting ready to share their music on October 8th in the 11:15 a.m. worship service. Echo Youth – Youth are diving into Echo the Story – a new curriculum aimed at helping students see the Big Picture of the Bible. They also continue to explore current events together in class.

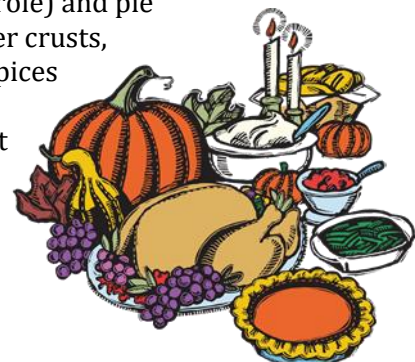

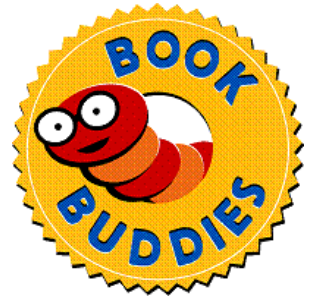
