This Month in Worship...

As we gather in worship this month, we conclude the great fifty-day season of Easter, celebrate the birthday of the church on Pentecost, and begin the season of growth after Pentecost we call "Ordinary Time." We also welcome some special guests as preachers during May, so be sure to be with us every week.

May 6 - 6th Sunday of Easter



On Sunday, May 6, our guest preacher at all three morning worship services will be the **Rev. Kathy Dickriede**, an ordained deacon in The United Methodist Church and the East Ohio Conference United Methodist Volunteers in Mission (UMVIM) coordinator.

Rev. Dickriede and her husband, Danny, have served actively in the national and international mission field since 2008 with a special emphasis at the Camphor Mission Station in Liberia. There, they have built relationships at the school, clinic, and church, and throughout the agricultural fields of the Camphor Mission. In her role with the East Ohio Conference, she promotes local, national, and international UMVIM trips, trains UMVIM team leaders, encourages partnerships across the global connection of our UMC, and invites others to join in this life-giving journey.

Please be sure to be with us in worship at 8 am, 9 am, or 11:15 am on Sunday, May 6.

May 13 - Ascension of the Lord Sunday + Festival of the Christian Home

Ascension Day is the fortieth day after Easter Sunday (this year, May 10) and is celebrated on the Seventh Sunday of Easter (this year, May 13). On this day, we gather to remember Christ's ascension into heaven as told in Acts 1.1-11.

During the 11:15 am worship service on May 13, we will welcome back two familiar friends: the **Rev. Cal Myers**, who served as pastor of The UMC of Berea from 1970 to 1993 and from 2000 to 2001, and the **Rev. Rollin Conway**, who served as pastor here from 1976 to 1984. They also will join us for an informal time of greeting during the Sunday school hour (10 am to 11 am) and for a brief reception after the 11:15 am worship service.

1961 - The Education Building was completed and used for the first time on July 4, 1961. The new building included the Chapel, Parlor, Offices, and Library. The total cost was \$400,000. Interestingly, we were just gifted the architect's original blueprints for this wing.

May 20 - Day of Pentecost + Heritage Sunday - 50th Anniversary of The UMC

Please note, on Sunday, May 20, our morning schedule will be adjusted as follows:

8 a.m. worship in the Chapel; 9 am adult Sunday school; 10:30 a.m. worship in the Sanctuary



The Day of Pentecost is the fiftieth and final day of the Easter season, celebrating the gift of the Holy Spirit to the church as told in Acts 2. You are invited to wear red or a fire-inspired color in celebration of Pentecost. May 20 is also Heritage Sunday, a special celebration in The United Methodist Church which marks the day when John Wesley’s heart was “strangely warmed” on May 24, 1738, while attending a meeting on Aldersgate Street in London. This year, we also will celebrate the 50th anniversary of The United Methodist Church, formed through the union of the Evangelical United Brethren Church and the Methodist Church in 1968.

During the 10:30 am worship service, we also will celebrate confirmation, welcoming youth as professing members of the church and of this local congregation.

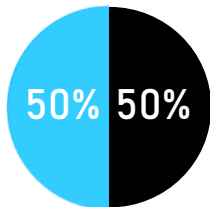
May 27 - Trinity Sunday + Peace with Justice Sunday

Please note, on Sunday, May 27, we will begin our summer schedule:

8 a.m. worship in the Chapel; 9 a.m. arise! worship in Wesley Hall ; 10:30 a.m. worship in the Sanctuary

The First Sunday after Pentecost is a celebration of the Trinity: one God in three persons. It is an opportunity to remember and celebrate that our Creator, in whose image we are created, exists fundamentally in community. In recognition of our call to be together, The UMC also receives a **special offering to support Peace with Justice ministries**.

Peace with Justice Sunday, created by the 1988 General Conference, is one of The United Methodist Church’s six church-wide Special Sundays with offerings. Your offering allows The United Methodist Church to have a voice in advocating for peace and justice through many programs in the United States and around the world.

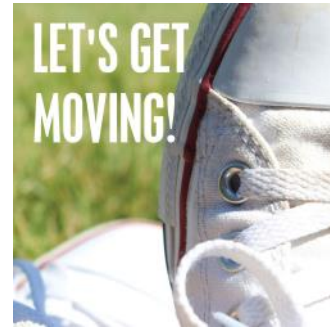

The book "50 Women Every Christian Should Know: Learning From Heroines of the Faith" is in the category of "Leadership Development." It highlights women who have shown great courage and dedication through Christian service and leadership.

Some familiar examples of these brave women are Sojourner Truth and Harriet Tubman who escaped slavery to help other slaves on the Underground Railroad, Florence Nightingale who reformed the nursing profession during the war in Crimea, Corrie ten Boom who survived a concentration camp in WWII and started a world-wide ministry and wrote several books, and Madeleine L'Engle who wrote more than 60 books including "A Wrinkle in Time." However, there are several others who may not be as well-known, such as Katharina Luther who left a convent in Wittenberg, Germany in 1523 and married Martin Luther and Anne Askew who was burned at the stake as a heretic in England in 1546 for spreading the news of the reformation.

This book provides a brief 6-8 page introduction into the lives of each of these women, which may interest the reader to find out more about them.

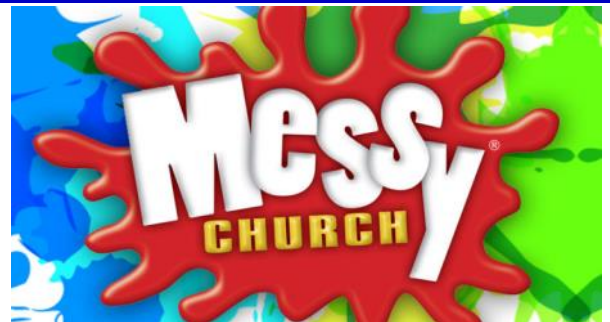
Cinco de Mayo Paint Project!

UMC Social Principles

To help guide our thinking and acting about how we live in and are engaged in ministry in the world, The United Methodist Church has a series of statements called "Social Principles" to guide the church in its efforts to co-create with God a world of justice and peace. "Our Social Creed" is a basic statement of our convictions, and our "Social Principles" explain more fully how United Methodists are called to live in relationship with God, God's creation, and the rest of humanity. As part of our *Book of Discipline*, the "Social Principles" serve as a guide and strengthen our witness across the world, reflecting who we aspire to be as a Christian community engaged in the realities of our world.

The 2012 General Conference of The UMC tasked the General Board of Church and Society with conducting listening sessions across the connection regarding to our "Social Principles." These listening sessions resulted in the 2016 General Conference of The UMC further tasking the General Board of Church and Society with bringing revised "Social Principles" to the 2020 General Conference. On April 12, 2018, this draft was released, and United Methodists now are invited to weigh in on the content throughout the following months.

This invitation provides us with a wonderful opportunity to be informed regarding our "Social Principles," to be in conversation with one another, and to provide feedback to those who will be presenting a final draft to the General Conference in 2020. **All are welcome to join us in the Parlor on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 pm and Thursday mornings at 9:30 a.m., May 2/3 through May 23/24 (four weeks) for prayerful conversation and learning together.** For more information, please contact Pastor Nathan (nhowe@umcb.org).

Well known for her poetry as well as her leadership in the Methodist Church, Harkness won a scholarship to Cornell (one of the few major universities that accepted women) and graduated in 1912. She taught at the School of Religious Education and Social Service, Boston University emphasizing the elimination of racism, health, and hygiene facing immigrants. Grow in Faith. Have Fun. Change the World.

Imagine disciples from all generations gathered around dinner tables and gathered together for worship. Imagine children heading outside and upstairs for a Vacation Bible School style experiences. Imagine adults gathered together to explore faithful stewardship of the earth and our communities. Imagine having a conversation across the generations about God’s work and plans for creation, and how we can be a part of this vision.

This event is for disciples of all ages. There will be childcare for ages 3 and younger. Children’s program is open to age 3-6th grade. Adult program open to 7th grade and older. Each night, we will gather at 6 p.m. for dinner and worship, then move out to adult and children’s activities, then come back together for worship and blessing. We’ll conclude by 8 p.m.

Children will have a Vacation Bible School like experience using “ReNew” by Sparkhouse publishers – the same group that we use for Sunday School. Adults will reflect on

personal discipleship and creation, outreach opportunities, our social creed as United Methodists, and learn about our global mission partnerships. Youth are invited to volunteer with the children, or participate with the adults.
