


SUMMER BOOK CLUB: JUST MERCY, BY BRYAN STEVENSON

Monday, August 13 at 6:30 PM


On Monday, August 13 at 6:30 PM, all are welcome to join us in Room 13 for a discussion of the book, *Just Mercy: A Story of Justice and Redemption*, by Bryan Stevenson.

As a young lawyer, Stevenson founded the Equal Justice Initiative, a legal practice dedicated to defending those most desperate and in need: the poor, the wrongly condemned, and women and children trapped int the furthest reaches of our criminal justice system. *Just Mercy* is Stevenson's powerful true story about the potential for mercy to redeem us and a clarion call to fix our broken system of "justice."

INTRODUCING SEED PACKETS SCATTERING SEEDS, GROWING FAITH & COMMUNITY

Learn more this August about a new vision for growing small community groups! This month we will debut a new resource we hope you'll **grab** (step 1). Pick it up outside of each worship space, then **gather** (step 2) some friends. Whether it's at your place of work, in your neighborhood, or long-time friends. Share with them the Word for the upcoming Sunday worship service, share what's on your hearts, and grow together in faith. In as little as half an hour at lunch, or a longer heart to heart on your porch, or at a coffee shop, you will create community, and **grow** (step 3) in faith together.

It's a simple approach – **Grab, Gather, Grow** – with a huge potential. Imagine if our worshipping congregation each gathered a few people together to scatter these seeds of faith, encouraged roots of discipleship, and grew into fruitful disciples. Friends can be invited from these small communities to join us for worship to dig deeper into these Scriptures and grow further in faith. And the cycle continues from there – small communities gather, disciples grab resources, and our congregation and community grow in faith.

What's in a seed packet? All that you need to host a faithful conversation. There will be a month's worth of resources in each packet. In each one, you'll find the week's preaching focus, based on a lectionary reading, reflection questions, prayer prompts, and more. We are not asking you to be a teacher, only a host of friends and the Spirit. We encourage you to begin praying about who you might invite to join you as you break open your first seed packet.






Beginning September 16, we will discuss Adam Hamilton's book *Unafraid: Living with Courage and Hope in Uncertain Times*.

The famous town was the scene of the first nationally recognized call for women to have the right to vote. The meeting place was the Methodist house which remains there in the heart of the town. Elizabeth Cady Stanton was the brave woman who made her patriotic stand, on July 19 and 20th, 1848. Altogether 68 women and 32 men signed the "Declaration of Sentiments. Women were granted the vote in 1920!!!





CELEBRATING THE 175TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH OF BEREA

In 1939, the Methodist Episcopal, Methodist Protestant, and the Methodist Episcopal Church, South merged. The Methodist Churches of Berea had the following women's organization:

Women's Foreign Mission Society 1870-1939

Women's Home Mission Society formed July 8, 1888 with 30 members

Ladies' Aid and Pastor's Aid was organized in 1861

These groups were combined in 1939 and formed the Women's Society of Christian Service.

Membership Covenant

"I desire to become a member of the Woman's Society of Christian Service of the First Methodist Church of Berea, Ohio. As such it is my purpose to join in helping to develop and support Christian work among women and children around the world: to develop the spiritual life; to study the needs of the world; to take such part in service activities as will strengthen the local church, improve civic, community, and world conditions, to enlist others in Christian fellowship, and cure funds for the activities in the local church, and the support of the work undertaken at home and abroad for the establishment of a World Christian Community."

From September 1, 1940 until December, 1941 (15 months) 134 members of First Methodist Episcopal Church signed this Covenant. The book is in the Archives of UMCB.
