

In the December Loose Change offering , \$183 was collected for the Cambodia Mission Partnership and will support scholarships for Cambodian students through our United Methodist Advance.




The Loose Change offering in January will be collected for UMCOR Sager-Brown.

In his address at the General Conference that year, Bishop Welch stated that MCOR would serve as a "voice of conscience among Methodists to act in the relief of human suffering without distinction of race, color, or creed." That mandate remains true to this day.

UMCOR's Vision: As the humanitarian relief and development arm of The United Methodist Church, UMCOR strengthens and transforms people and communities.

UMCOR's Mission: Compelled by Christ to be a voice of conscience on behalf of the people called Methodist, UMCOR works globally to alleviate human suffering and advance hope and healing.

NAMING OUR COMMITMENTS FOR 2019

Thank you to all of those who named their commitments to grow as disciples and participate in the life of our congregation in 2019.

As of December 15, 2018, 119 individuals or families named commitments for 2019; this is an increase from 109 individuals or families who named commitments for 2018. Financial commitments for 2019 total \$262,199; this is an increase from \$256,310 for 2018. Additionally, 30 individuals or families named commitments for 2019 who did not do so for 2018, and 36 individuals or families increased their financial commitment from 2018 to 2019. 
