## 2019 GENERAL CONFERENCE

## February 23-26, St. Louis, Missouri

A special session of the General Conference has been called for February 23 – 26 in St. Louis, Missouri with the purpose of receiving and acting upon a report from the Commission on a Way Forward and recommendations of the Council of Bishops.

The Commission on a Way Forward was brought together after the 2016 General Conference in order to engage in deep conversations about human sexuality and the unity of our denomination. These conversations have recognized that significant differences exist among United Methodist people regarding our interpretations of scripture and our theological tradition and how we apply those interpretations to matters of human sexuality, including same-gender marriage and the ordination of LGBTQ persons. The following information about the 2019 General Conference is adapted from a FAQ put together by our East Ohio delegates to the General Conference:

### What is the General Conference?

The General Conference is the primary legislative body of The United Methodist Church and the only body that speaks officially for the church. The General Conference meets once every four years, with the next session scheduled for 2020 in Minneapolis.

### Why has a "special session" of the General Conference been called for 2019?

The purpose of the 2019 General Conference is to receive and act upon the report of the Commission on a Way Forward, which was given the task to do a complete examination and propose possible revision of every paragraph of *The Book of Discipline of The UMC* concerning human sexuality and to explore options that help maintain and strengthen the unity of the church.

### What will be considered by the 2019 General Conference?

The following three plans will be presented by the Commission on a Way Forward:

*The One Church Plan*, which would allow decisions about whether to ordain LGBTQ persons or to allow same-gender weddings to be made closer to the conference and congregational level, respectively. This plan would remove the restrictive language against the practice of homosexuality as currently contained in *The Book of Discipline* and give assurances to pastors and conferences who in good conscience cannot perform same-gender weddings or ordain LGBTQ persons. This plan has been recommended by the Council of Bishops.

*The Traditionalist Plan,* which would affirm the current language in *The Book of Discipline* and seek to create swift and strong penalties for violations and create exit plans for churches and clergy who disagree.

*The Connectional Conference Plan*, which would allow conferences to choose among three connectional conferences for affiliation. The connectional conferences would align based on theology or perspective on LGBTQ ministry, whether traditionalist, progressive, or allowing for a variety of approaches. This plan would require multiple amendments to the denomination's constitution. *(continued on next page)* 

In preparation for the 2019 General Conference, our Council of Bishops has encouraged all United Methodists to pause and pray each day from 2:23 to 2:26 (am or pm), a segment of time chosen to represent the dates of the special session (Feb. 23 to Feb. 26). The following is a recommended format for four minutes of intentional prayer:

Invitation: Begin with a moment of holy silence for centering, settling, and focusing.

#### Minute #1: Prayer of Adoration

Good and great God, we recognize and celebrate that you are loving, kind, and faithful. You are everywhere in this world and beyond. You are as close as our next breath. With John Wesley, we rejoice knowing, "Best of all, you are with us." *Silence, concluding with, "Hear our prayer, O God."* 

#### Minute #2: Prayer of Thanks

God of grace, we thank you that you hear us when we pray and are ever ready and able to act in ways beyond anything we could ask or imagine. Thank you for our brothers and sisters around the world, and especially for those who have offered to serve by attending the special session of General Conference. Thank you for ordering our steps and preparing a way. *Silence, concluding with, "Hear our prayer, O God."* 

#### Minute #3: Prayer of Confession

Forgiving God, we confess that we have allowed fear and distrust to place distance between us and our brothers and sisters in the body of Christ. Forgive us for making idols out of our own thoughts, voices, and opinions. Thank you for forgiving us and for your perfect love that casts out all fear. *Silence, concluding with, "Hear our prayer, O God."* 

#### Minute #4: Prayer of Asking

God of peace and wisdom, from this time forward, may we walk with you in trust and peace, and with our brothers and sisters in the love and unity you desire. May we truly sing together in harmony a song of praise that draws all to you. Even now, may you bless those who attend the special session of the General Conference, assuring them of your love, filling them with your wisdom, preparing them with your peace. May they and we become more sensitive to the voice of your Holy Spirit, so that all we do will please you and bring you glory. *Silence, concluding with, "Hear our prayer, O God."* 

All these prayers we offer in the name of the Risen Christ, Amen.



By God's grace, we are making and maturing disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world! Your generosity—through your prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness—have made a real difference in our life together and in the lives of our neighbors. Thank you!

Here's just a small sample of the big difference you helped to make in 2018. Together, we:

- welcomed 4 individuals into the life of the church through baptism;
- welcomed 16 individuals into the life of this congregation through professing membership;
- welcomed an average of 199 individuals into our weekly Sunday morning worship gatherings;
- welcomed an average of 60 individuals to our monthly Messy Church gatherings;
- nurtured an average of 39 adults and 38 youth and children in Sunday morning Christian Formation classes and small groups;
- celebrated the lives of 16 saints from The UMC of Berea whose lives on this side of death came to an end—but whose impact continues to be experienced among us;
- sent out 36 missionaries into ministry in Baldwin, Louisiana (UMCOR Sager Brown) and in Rochester, Pennsylvania (Youth Work Mission) in addition to countless missionaries who serve throughout our local community in a variety of ways and places each and every week;
- completed construction of new restrooms and a new serving pantry attached to Wesley Hall, both of which will help support ongoing and new ministries;
- in addition to meeting our congregation's operating expenses in full, we also participated together in the larger body of Christ by giving nearly \$100,000 in 2018 to support transformative mission both locally and globally, including:
  - o \$78,962 to support 100% of our Shared Ministry Goal in 2018;
  - \$4,864 on "special giving" Sundays, including Human Relations Day, UMCOR Sunday, Native American Ministries Sunday, Peace with Justice Sunday, World Communion Sunday, and United Methodist Student Day;
  - \$5,312 to support other UMC-related missions, including the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) in its ongoing response to natural disasters both nationally and internationally;
  - **\$4,563 to support local mission partnerships** with Berea Community Outreach, OhioGuidestone, SCAN, Hanson House, and Grindstone Elementary School; and
  - o **\$4,637 to support our global mission partnerships** in Guatemala and Cambodia.

The Loose Change offering on February 10, 2019 will be collected for the Southwest Community Access Network (SCAN) Hunger Center.


As part of the Hunger Network of Greater Cleveland, The SCAN Hunger Center in Berea serves families in need of


## LOVE TO STAY - MARRIAGE ENRICHMENT CLASS

For **February 11**, read **Before We Were Yours** by Lisa Wingate. (Please note this is a change of book.)

Based on one of America's most notorious real-life scandals—in which Georgia Tann, director of a Memphis-based adoption organization, kidnapped and sold poor children to wealthy families all over the country—Lisa Wingate's riveting, wrenching, and ultimately uplifting tale reminds us how, even though the paths we take can lead to many places, the heart never forgets where we belong.

For March 11, read Killer of the Flower Moon: The Osage Murders and the Beginning of the FBI by David Grann. A true-crime story begins in 1921 with the murder of a Osage woman named Anna Brown. The Osage, driven from their land in Kansas to a rocky, untillable parcel in Oklahoma, ironically had become the richest people per capita in the world due to vast oil reserves under their land. But most Osage, like Ana, were deemed "incompetent" to manage their wealth and so were assigned white "guardians" to do so. And when a white man married an Osage woman, he had control of the funds. It's not a leap to see that this system invited abuse – and far worse. By 1923, 24 Osage had been murdered, along with several people investigating the crimes. It was all about the money.
