








FRIDAY, MAY 3, 2019 - 7 PM, ROOM 27

She was born in Homer, Ohio where you can see the sign outside her home! Victoria attended a debate between Elizabeth Cady Stanton and Frederick Douglass and she decided to advocate for the right to vote. Woodhull was the candidate in 1872 from the Equal Rights Party, supporting women's suffrage and equal rights. Frederick Douglass became her running mate. Although her "run" was only four weeks long, Victoria fanned the flames for women's rights.

LOOKING AHEAD: 2019-2020 Small Group for Contemplative Study

SUNDAY MORNINGS DURING CHRISTIAN FORMATION

In 2006 Dr. Mark Collier initiated a small group for a contemplative study of writings from Thomas Merton, who was a Trappist monk, writer, theologian, mystic, poet, social activist and scholar of comparative religion. Participants throughout the years have grown in their comfort level with the contemplative dialogue process and come to see the power and potential of engaging in this way with one another.

Source materials have included **Convictions: How I Learned What Matters Most** by progressive theologian and New Testament scholar Marcus Borg and **Living Buddha, Living Christ** by Vietnamese Buddhist monk and peace activist Thich Nhat Hanh as well as collections of sermons from prominent preachers such as Barbara Brown Taylor, Peter Gomes and Frederick Buechner.

Grounded: Finding God in the World - A Spiritual Revolution by historian Diana Butler Bass, who focuses on the history of Christianity, was used in the 2018-2019 sessions. A copy of the book will be donated to the church library in honor of Mark Collier and in appreciation for his thirteen years leading the contemplative group.
