OCTOBER IS BRING A FRIEND TO CHURCH MONTH!



Bring a Friend to Church Month is here! Please KEEP praying about who you might invite to church this month, then ask! Whether it's to worship, a fun event (list below) or a faith formation group, we are encouraging YOU to bring friends with you to church in October. You love your church home and church family – so consider how much your friends, family, and neighbors might as well. Whether they haven't been to church in a long time, or have never been to church, now is the perfect time to casually invite them to join you.

Some tips: Pray about it first - who does God bring to your mind and heart? Approach your friend casually about it, and invite them to come with you. Invites to a singular event usually go better than a general invite to begin a relationship with a church. Invite them to a particular day and event. Sit by them, worship or work alongside them in worship or service, or introduce them to folks at a fun event. For some people, worship isn't the first thing they want to try at a church – so we've prepared many varied opportunities to get to know us.

OCTOBER E-BIT ("ENVIRONMENTAL TIDBIT") FROM CHURCH & SOCIETY

As fall approaches and we start to prepare our lawns for winter, there are benefits to mulching leaves into your lawn. Earthworms and microorganisms turn mulched leaves into usable organic matter which help your grass be healthier. For larger amounts of leaves, they can be used as mulch in plant beds or to add to a compost pile - the ultimate in recycling!

Also, throughout the year, there are many benefits to mulching grass clippings back into the lawn. It reduces time (no bagging required!) and it adds organic matter (e.g. nitrogen) back into the soil to help your grass be healthier too. One reason you might not want to mulch grass clippings is if chemical pesticides and synthetic fertilizers are used often on the lawn. (Another reason to not use these items!)
