Prelude

Proclamation of the Easter Message—John 20.1-18 (CEB)

¹ Early in the morning of the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. ² She ran to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they've put him." ³ Peter and the other disciple left to go to the tomb. ⁴ They were running together, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and was the first to arrive at the tomb. ⁵ Bending down to take a look, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he didn't go in. ⁶ Following him, Simon Peter entered the tomb and saw the linen cloths lying there. ⁷ He also saw the face cloth that had been on Jesus' head. It wasn't with the other clothes but was folded up in its own place. ⁸ Then the other disciple, the one who arrived at the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed. ⁹ They didn't yet understand the scripture that Jesus must rise from the dead. ¹⁰ Then the disciples returned to the place where they were staying.

¹¹ Mary stood outside near the tomb, crying. As she cried, she bent down to look into the tomb. ¹² She saw two angels dressed in white, seated where the body of Jesus had been, one at the head and one at the foot. ¹³ The angels asked her, "Woman, why are you crying?"

She replied, "They have taken away my Lord, and I don't know where they've put him." ¹⁴As soon as she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she didn't know it was Jesus. ¹⁵ Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you crying? Who are you looking for?"

Thinking he was the gardener, she replied, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him and I will get him."

¹⁶ Jesus said to her, "Mary."

She turned and said to him in Aramaic, "Rabbouni" (which means Teacher).

¹⁷ Jesus said to her, "Don't hold on to me, for I haven't yet gone up to my Father. Go to my brothers and sisters and tell them, 'I'm going up to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'"

¹⁸ Mary Magdalene left and announced to the disciples, "I've seen the Lord." Then she told them what he said to her.

Lighting the Christ Candle

In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God. *Through the Word was life, and the life was the light for all people.* The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness does not extinguish the light. Reaffirming our Baptismal Covenant

Sisters and brothers in Christ, we are made one with the death of Jesus Christ, and we are raised with Christ and all creation to walk in newness of life through the gift of baptism by water and the Spirit.
The same Spirit who egives us life empowers us with many gifts to serve as new creatures, to renounce all wickedness and resist all evil, to proclaim the good news, to submit to Christ as Lord, and to be joined together as Christ's body—across time and place—serving as Christ's representatives in the world.
We all start here. The Spirit calls and leads us all. *Thanks be to God!*Remember you are baptized, and be thankful! *Glory to God! Amen.*

We Grow in God's Word

Leader: With disciples of every time and place, let us listen for the word of God among us. **People:** *Our ears and hearts are open.*

First Lesson—Acts 10.34-43 (CEB)

³⁴ Peter said, "I really am learning that God doesn't show partiality to one group of people over another. ³⁵ Rather, in every nation, whoever worships him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶ This is the message of peace he sent to the Israelites by proclaiming the good news through Jesus Christ: He is Lord of all! ³⁷ You know what happened throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism John preached. ³⁸ You know about Jesus of Nazareth, whom God anointed with the Holy Spirit and endowed with power. Jesus traveled around doing good and healing everyone oppressed by the devil because God was with him. ³⁹ We are witnesses of everything he did, both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They killed him by hanging him on a tree, ⁴⁰ but God raised him up on the third day and allowed him to be seen, ⁴¹ not by everyone but by us. We are witnesses whom God chose beforehand, who ate and drank with him after God raised him from the dead. ⁴² He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one whom God appointed as judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³ All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

Leader: The word of God for the people of God.

People: Thanks be to God.

Second Lesson—Colossians 3.1-4 (CEB)

¹ Therefore, if you were raised with Christ, look for the things that are above where Christ is sitting at God's right side. ² Think about the things above and not things on earth. ³ You died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴ When Christ, who is your life, is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

The Great Thanksgiving

In these extraordinary circumstances, you are invited this morning to have a piece of bread ready to receive as we participate in the holy mystery of Communion, even while we are physically apart. We will receive the body of Christ at the same time, even though not in the same place, trusting that through the presence of the Holy Spirit, our sharing of bread is sacred, holy, and sacramental as our spirits interact with one another's. If the Risen Christ is really present in all times and places, then surely Christ is really present among us now. There is no substitute for gathering in person with one another; however, through God's grace, still we are held in communion with God and with one another.

The Lord be with you. *And also with you.* Lift up your hearts. *We lift them up to the Lord.* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. *It is right to give our thanks and praise.* It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, who has raised Jesus Christ from the dead,

who has given us the promise of new life and new creation in Christ's spirit and name. We give you thanks for prophets and apostles, for the disciples who discovered the empty tomb, for the faith and testimony of our ancestors in the faith,

and for women and men in every age who bear witness to the power of the risen Christ for healing, reconciliation, and new life.

And so, with the fullness of your creation, we praise your name on this Easter Day as we join that unending hymn:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full or your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Holy are you, and holy is your Word made flesh in Jesus Christ, who in life brought healing and liberation to all who were oppressed; who even in death on the cross did not waver from your way of nonviolence but forgave the ones who crucified him; and who rose from the dead and lives in and through us to this day.

On the night he gave himself so fully, Jesus gathered with the disciples, took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, and shared it, saying: "Receive, eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this to remember me."

When the supper was over, Jesus took the cup, again gave thanks to you, and gave it to the disciples, saying:

"Drink from this, all of you; this is my life in the new covenant,

poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sin. Do this to remember me."

And so, in remembrance of these and all your mighty acts in Jesus Christ,

we offer ourselves now, as a holy and living sacrifice,

in praise and thanksgiving for new life as your Easter people,

in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered in your spirit and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the real presence of the risen Christ,

that we may be the body of Christ for all who yearn for new life.

By your Spirit, make us one with Christ, one with each other,

and one in ministry and mission to all the world,

until Christ comes again in glory and we feast together in communion as your beloved.

God of newness and mystery, God of wonder and love,

God of resurrection and new creation, we praise your name and rejoice in our life in you. All honor and glory is yours, now and forever. *Amen.*
