

All are invited and encouraged to attend an information session on Saturday, March 7 from 10 AM to Noon at Garfield Memorial UMC.

The Protocol of Reconciliation and Grace through Separation will be presented. This protocol is one of the major proposals to be acted upon at General Conference 2020, but it does not represent a final decision for a course of action for The United Methodist Church. When General Conference receives this recommendation as proposed legislation in May, delegates will be able to adopt it, modify it, or do something different altogether.

Members of the East Ohio General Conference delegation and Bishop Tracy S. Malone will give leadership to this information session. It will be live-streamed also if you wish to watch it online (information will be provided for how to live-stream the session as soon as it is available). Those who wish to carpool together to the information session should plan to leave our church parking lot by 9:15 AM on March 7.




We need lots of hands to make our Messy Easter and Easter Egg hunt a grand expression of love and generosity!

SAFE SANCTUARIES UPDATE & TRAINING


TUESDAY, MARCH 3 7 PM, ROOM 13
