Proclamation of the Easter Message—Mark 16.1-8 (CEB)

¹When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they could go and anoint Jesus' dead body. ²Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they came to the tomb. ³They were saying to each other, "Who's going to roll the stone away from the entrance for us?" ⁴When they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away. (And it was a very large stone!) ⁵Going into the tomb, they saw a young man in a white robe seated on the right side; and they were startled. ⁶But he said to them, "Don't be alarmed! You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised. He isn't here. Look, here's the place where they laid him. ⁷Go, tell his disciples, especially Peter, that he is going ahead of you into Galilee. You will see him there, just as he told you." ⁸Overcome with terror and dread, they fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid.

Children's Message

First Lesson—Acts 10.34-43 (CEB)

³⁴Peter said, "I really am learning that God doesn't show partiality to one group of people over another. ³⁵Rather, in every nation, whoever worships him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶This is the message of peace he sent to the Israelites by proclaiming the good news through Jesus Christ: He is Lord of all! ³⁷You know what happened throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism John preached. ³⁸You know about Jesus of Nazareth, whom God anointed with the Holy Spirit and endowed with power. Jesus traveled around doing good and healing everyone oppressed by the devil because God was with him. ³⁹We are witnesses of everything he did, both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They killed him by hanging him on a tree, ⁴⁰but God raised him up on the third day and allowed him to be seen, ⁴¹not by everyone but by us. We are witnesses whom God chose beforehand, who ate and drank with him after God raised him from the dead. ⁴²He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one whom God appointed as judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

Second Lesson—1 Corinthians 15.1-11 (CEB)

¹Brothers and sisters, I want to call your attention to the good news that I preached to you, which you also received and in which you stand. ²You are being saved through it if you hold on to the message I preached to you, unless somehow you believed it for nothing. ³I passed on to you as most important what I also received: Christ died for our sins in line with the scriptures, ⁴he was buried, and he rose on the third day in line with the scriptures. ⁵He appeared to Cephas, then to the Twelve, ⁶and then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at once—most of them are still alive to this day, though some have died. ⁷Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, ⁸and last of all he appeared to me, as if I were born at the wrong time. ⁹I'm the least important of the apostles. I don't deserve to be called an apostle, because I harassed God's church. ¹⁰I am what I am by God's grace, and God's grace hasn't been for nothing. In fact, I have worked harder than all the others—that is, it wasn't me but the grace of God that is with me. ¹¹So then, whether you heard the message from me or them, this is what we preach and this is what you have believed.

The Great Thanksgiving

In these extraordinary circumstances, you are invited this morning to have prepared Communion elements or a simple piece of bread ready to receive as we participate together in the holy mystery of Communion, even while we remain physically apart. If the risen Christ really is present in all times and places, then surely Christ really is present among us even now. There is no substitute for gathering together in person; however, through God's grace, we trust that we still are held in communion with God and with one another.

The Lord be with you. ***And also with you.***

Lift up your hearts. ***We lift them up to the Lord.***

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. ***It is right to give our thanks and praise.***

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, who has raised Jesus Christ from the dead,

who has given us the promise of new life and new creation in Christ's spirit and name.

We give you thanks for prophets and apostles, for the disciples who discovered the empty tomb, for the faith and testimony of our ancestors in the faith,

and for women and men in every age who bear witness to the power of the risen Christ for healing, reconciliation, and new life.

And so, with the fullness of your creation, we praise your name on this Easter Day as we join that unending hymn:

***Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.***

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Holy are you, and holy is your Word made flesh in Jesus Christ, who in life brought healing and liberation to all who were oppressed; who even in death on the cross did not waver from your way of nonviolence but forgave the ones who crucified him; and who rose from the dead and lives in and through us to this day.

On the night he gave himself so fully, Jesus gathered with the disciples, took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, and shared it, saying: "Receive, eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this to remember me."

When the supper was over, Jesus took the cup, again gave thanks to you, and gave it to the disciples, saying:
"Drink from this, all of you; this is my life in the new covenant, poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sin. Do this to remember me."

And so, in remembrance of these and all your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves now, as a holy and living sacrifice, in praise and thanksgiving for new life as your Easter people, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith:
Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered in your spirit and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the real presence of the risen Christ, that we may be the body of Christ for all who yearn for new life. By your Spirit, make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry and mission to all the world, until Christ comes again in glory and we feast together in communion as your beloved. God of newness and mystery, God of wonder and love, God of resurrection and new creation, we praise your name and rejoice in our life in you. All honor and glory is yours, now and forever. ***Amen.***
