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We Grow in God's Word

Leader: With disciples of every time and place, let us listen for the word of God among us. **People:** *Our ears and hearts are open.*

First Lesson—Romans 8.12-17 (CEB)

¹² So then, brothers and sisters, we have an obligation, but it isn't an obligation to ourselves to live our lives on the basis of selfishness. ¹³ If you live on the basis of selfishness, you are going to die. But if by the Spirit you put to death the actions of the body, you will live. ¹⁴ All who are led by God's Spirit are God's sons and daughters. ¹⁵ You didn't receive a spirit of slavery to lead you back again into fear, but you received a Spirit that shows you are adopted as his children. With this Spirit, we cry, "Abba, Father." ¹⁶ The same Spirit agrees with our spirit, that we are God's children. ¹⁷ But if we are children, we are also heirs. We are God's heirs and fellow heirs with Christ, if we really suffer with him so that we can also be glorified with him.

Leader: The word of God for the people of God. **People:** *Thanks be to God.*

Gospel Lesson—John 3.1-17 (CEB)

¹ There was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a Jewish leader. ²He came to Jesus at night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God, for no one could do these miraculous signs that you do unless God is with him."

- ³ Jesus answered, "I assure you, unless someone is born anew, it's not possible to see God's kingdom."
- ⁴ Nicodemus asked, "How is it possible for an adult to be born? It's impossible to enter the mother's womb for a second time and be born, isn't it?"

⁵ Jesus answered, "I assure you, unless someone is born of water and the Spirit, it's not possible to enter God's kingdom. ⁶ Whatever is born of the flesh is flesh, and whatever is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⁷ Don't be surprised that I said to you, 'You must be born anew.' ⁸ God's Spirit blows wherever it wishes. You hear its sound, but you don't know where it comes from or where it is going. It's the same with everyone who is born of the Spirit."

⁹ Nicodemus said, "How are these things possible?"

¹⁰ "Jesus answered, "You are a teacher of Israel and you don't know these things? ¹¹ I assure you that we speak about what we know and testify about what we have seen, but you don't receive our testimony. ¹² If I have told you about earthly things and you don't believe, how will you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? ¹³ No one has gone up to heaven except the one who came down from heaven, the Son of Man. ¹⁴ Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up ¹⁵ so that everyone who believes in him will have eternal life. ¹⁶ God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him won't perish but will have eternal life. ¹⁷ God didn't send his Son into the world to judge the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

Life-giving God, awaken me to your threefold presence in the world this day that I may share your love with others as freely as you have done for us in Christ. Amen.


Evening Prayer (week of Sunday, May 30):

Update Regarding Worship Practices

On Thursday, May 13, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) updated its guidance for individuals who are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 (https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/fully-vaccinated-guidance.html), and on Monday, May 17, the Ohio Department of Health issued a new order to align with this updated CDC guidance (https://coronavirus.ohio.gov/static/publicorders/rev-2nd-final-amended-do-soc-dist-remove-face-cover-21.pdf).

In accordance with these updates from public health officials, in our worship life together, beginning **next Sunday**, **June 6**:

- we will continue offering online worship on Sundays (moving to 10:30 AM on June 6) for those who are either unable or uncomfortable gathering in a public setting;
- if you are feeling ill or experiencing symptoms, please stay home and worship with us online until you are feeling healthy and symptom-free;
- if you are fully vaccinated, beginning June 6, you are no longer required to wear a mask or to practice physical distancing;
- if you are not yet fully vaccinated, you are asked to continue wearing a mask and physically distancing from members of other households, in order to protect yourself and other unvaccinated or immunocompromised individuals;
- we will resume singing as a congregation, but only those who are fully vaccinated should do so without wearing a mask.
