Reminder of the Changes to Our Worship Practices

In accordance with these updates from public health officials, in our worship life together:

- we will continue offering online worship on Sundays at 10:30 AM for those who are either unable or uncomfortable gathering in a public setting;
- if you are feeling ill or experiencing symptoms, please stay home and worship with us online until you are feeling healthy and symptom-free;
- if you are fully vaccinated, you are no longer required to wear a mask or to practice physical distancing;
- if you are not yet fully vaccinated, you are asked to continue wearing a mask and physically distancing from members of other households, in order to protect yourself and other unvaccinated or immunocompromised individuals;
- we will resume singing as a congregation, but only those who are fully vaccinated should do so without wearing a mask.
