

¹ Therefore, as a prisoner for the Lord, I encourage you to live as people worthy of the call you received from God. ² Conduct yourselves with all humility, gentleness, and patience. Accept each other with love, ³ and make an effort to preserve the unity of the Spirit with the peace that ties you together. ⁴ You are one body and one spirit, just as God also called you in one hope. ⁵ There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, ⁶ and one God and Father of all, who is over all, through all, and in all.

⁷God has given his grace to each one of us measured out by the gift that is given by Christ. ⁸That's why scripture says, *When he climbed up to the heights, he captured prisoners, and he gave gifts to people.*

⁹What does the phrase "he climbed up" mean if it doesn't mean that he had first gone down into the lower regions, the earth? ¹⁰The one who went down is the same one who climbed up above all the heavens so that he might fill everything.

¹¹ He gave some apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers. ¹² His purpose was to equip God's people for the work of serving and building up the body of Christ ¹³ until we all reach the unity of faith and knowledge of God's Son. God's goal is for us to become mature adults—to be fully grown, measured by the standard of the fullness of Christ. ¹⁴ As a result, we aren't supposed to be infants any longer who can be tossed and blown around by every wind that comes from teaching with deceitful scheming and the tricks people play to deliberately mislead others. ¹⁵ Instead, by speaking the truth with love, let's grow in every way into Christ, ¹⁶ who is the head. The whole body grows from him, as it is joined and held together by all the supporting ligaments. The body makes itself grow in that it builds itself up with love as each one does its part.

The Great Thanksgiving

If you are worshiping with us from home, you are invited this morning to have some simple Communion elements ready—perhaps a bit of bread, a cracker, and/or some juice—to receive as we participate together in the holy mystery of Communion. We will receive the elements at the same time, though not in the same place, trusting that through the presence of the Holy Spirit, our sharing is sacramental as our spirits interact with God's and with one another's. If the risen Christ is present in all times and places, then surely Christ really is present among us even when we are apart. Through God's grace, we trust that we are held in communion with God and with each other.

Iesus calls all creation to be at table with him:

the sick and the uncertain, the vulnerable and the exposed, the privileged and the powerful. From north and south, east and west, Jesus calls us to come and be at this table together as a foretaste of the fullness of God's household.

The Lord be with you. *And also with you.*Lift up your hearts. *We lift them up to the Lord.*Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. *It is right to give our thanks and praise.*

It is right, and a great joy to praise you, O Loving, Living, Liberating God.

In the beginning, your wisdom danced through the void, calling forth creation, light, and life.

Through love, you form us in your image, calling us to love you in return.

And even when we do not—even when we turn from you,

abandoning your life-giving ways of justice and mercy and compassion—

even then you do not reject us but continue to call us and to claim us as your own.

We were slaves in Egypt, and you freed us.

We were hungry and thirsty in the wilderness, and you nourished us.

We had no home, and you welcomed us.

We worshiped idols of our own design, and you called us to return to you.

And so, we praise you, joining our voices with the voices of all creation in their unending hymn:

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

You are holy, O God, and blessed is Jesus Christ.

Throughout his life, he called surprising people to come follow:

fisherfolk, tax collectors, children, obvious sinners, deniers, betrayers.

On the cross, he made himself vulnerable to the powers of this world,

showing in the wounds on his body your gracious foolishness, O God,

for loving such a fickle and self-centered world.

Yet from this same cross, O God, you have undone all our pretended wisdom:

drawing light from darkness, power from humiliation,

enduring peace from our fearful violence, life from death itself.

He took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to the disciples, and said:

"Receive, eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this to remember me."

When the supper was over, Jesus took the cup, again gave thanks to you, shared it, and said:

"Drink this, all of you; this is my life, given for you. Do this to remember me."

And so, remembering all your gracious acts in Jesus Christ,

we offer ourselves now in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice

in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim together the mystery of faith:

Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

Come now, Lord Jesus. *Come now, Lord Jesus.*

Come now, Holy Spirit. Come now, Holy Spirit.

Come and fill these simple gifts of bread and wine.

Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ,
