

They want to be greeted with honor in the markets. ³⁹ They long for places of honor in the synagogues and at banquets. ⁴⁰ They are the ones who cheat widows out of their homes, and to show off they say long prayers. They will be judged most harshly."

⁴¹ Jesus sat across from the collection box for the temple treasury and observed how the crowd gave their money. Many rich people were throwing in lots of money. ⁴² One poor widow came forward and put in two small copper coins worth a penny. ⁴³ Jesus called his disciples to him and said, "I assure you that this poor widow has put in more than everyone who's been putting money in the treasury. ⁴⁴ All of them are giving out of their spare change. But she from her hopeless poverty has given everything she had, even what she needed to live on."

"Back to Basics" Worship Series

Sundays through November 21, 9 AM in the Sanctuary & online, 11 AM in Wesley Hall

At The United Methodist Church of Berea, our mission is "to make and mature disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." Each year, during the fall, we re-consider what this mission statement means for our lives as disciples and our life together as a community of faith.

What is a disciple? How do we mature as disciples?

How do we "make disciples" or help others to mature as disciples?

How do we transform, or make a real positive difference, in the world?

How can we become more fully engaged and flourishing as we live in the way of Christ?

We will explore together a model for Christian discipleship built around *five essential practices* that God called each of us to engage in both personally and together as we center our lives more fully on loving God and loving others. Join us in worship in as we get "back to the basics" of our mission and discipleship. Here the practices we will be focusing on in coming Sundays:
