First Lesson—Jeremiah 33.14-16 (*CEB*)

¹⁴ The time is coming, declares the LORD, when I will fulfill my gracious promise with the people of Israel and Judah. ¹⁵ In those days and at that time, I will raise up a righteous branch from David's line, who will do what is just and right in the land. ¹⁶ In those days, Judah will be saved and Jerusalem will live in safety. And this is what he will be called: The LORD Is Our Righteousness.

Second Lesson—Psalm 25.1-10 (adapted from UMH 756-757)

To you, O Lord, I offer my life.

O my God, in you I trust;

do not let me be put to shame; do not let my enemies exult over me.

Do not let those who wait for you be put to shame;

instead, let those be ashamed who are treacherous without excuse.

Make me to know your ways, O Lord;

teach me your paths.

Lead me in your truth, and teach me,

for you are the God who saves me; for you I wait all day long.

Be mindful of your mercy, O Lord, and of your steadfast love, for they have been from of old.

Do not remember the sins of my youth or my wrongdoing; according to your steadfast love remember me, for the sake of your goodness, O Lord!

Good and upright is the Lord, instructing sinners in the way. God guides the weak to justice, teaching them the way.

All the paths of the Lord are steadfast love and faithfulness, for those who keep the Lord's covenant and instructions.

Gospel Lesson—Luke 21.25-36 (*CEB*)

²⁵ "There will be signs in the sun, moon, and stars. On the earth, there will be dismay among nations in their confusion over the roaring of the sea and surging waves. ²⁶ The planets and other heavenly bodies will be shaken, causing people to faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world. ²⁷ Then they will see the Sone of Man coming on a cloud with power and great splendor. ²⁸ Now when these things begin to happen, stand up straight and raise your heads, because your redemption is near."

²⁹ Jesus told them a parable: "Look at the fig tree and all the trees. ³⁰ When they sprout leaves, you can see for yourselves and know that summer is near. ³¹ In the same way, when you see these things happening, you know that God's kingdom is near. ³² I assure you that this generation won't pass away until everything has happened. ³³ Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will certainly not pass away.

³⁴ "Take care that your hearts aren't dulled by drinking parties, drunkenness, and the anxieties of day-to-day life. Don't let that day fall upon you unexpectedly, ³⁵ like a trap. It will come upon everyone who lives on the face of the whole earth. ³⁶ Stay alert at all times, praying that you are strong enough to escape everything that is about to happen and to stand before the Son of Man."


