Lighting the Fourth Candle on the Advent Wreath

Sometimes, when we are trying something new or facing a difficult decision,

when we want to celebrate something or feel lost and alone and uncertain:

sometimes, we need a blessing.

Maybe we do not use the word, "blessing."

We call it "advice" or "support" or "companionship":

someone to come along beside us, so even if our problem is not "fixed," at least we're not alone.

Mary, facing an incomprehensible burden and gift, runs to her cousin's house,

searching for someone who knows something about what she's facing, looking for a place to hide. And there, with Elizabeth, Mary receives a blessing.

The prophet Micah spoke of a blessing coming in an unexpected place.

Yet, by God's grace, the little town of Bethlehem would be a little town of blessing.

We light this fourth candle as a sign of our love, trusting that God's blessing is with us —holding us and covering us— as we make our way back home.

(The fourth candle is lit)

Living Christ, give us faith to trust you, hope to follow you, love to live for you, and wisdom to perceive you. *We trust you, we love you, we praise you. Amen.*
