Sisters and brothers in Christ:

Through the sacrament of baptism God's Spirit initiates us into Christ's holy church, incorporates us into God's saving work,

and gives us new birth through water and the Spirit.

Today, we come to these waters to renew our commitments together to Christ who has raised us, to the Spirit who has birthed us, and to the Creator who is making all things new.

On behalf of the whole church, I ask you,

will you turn away from the powers of sin and death? We renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness, reject the evil powers of this world, and repent of our sin.

Will you allow the Spirit to use you as prophets to the powers that be?

We accept the freedom and power God gives us to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves.

Will you proclaim the good news and live as Christ's body on earth?

We confess Jesus Christ as our Savior, put our whole trust in grace, and promise to serve Christ as Lord in union with the church which Christ has opened to people of all cultures, ages, and ethnicities, all orientations, identities, and abilities.

Will you be living witnesses to the gospel, individually and together, wherever you are and in all you do?

We will remain faithful members of Christ's holy church and serve as Christ's representatives in the world.

Will you receive and profess the Christian faith as contained in our scriptures and in the life and ministry of Jesus the Christ, nurturing one another in living that faith together?

Gospel Lesson—Matthew 2.13-22 (CEB)

¹³When the magi had departed, an angel from the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Get up. Take the child and his mother and escape to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you, for Herod will soon search for the child in order to kill him." ¹⁴Joseph got up and, during the night, took the child and his mother to Egypt. ¹⁵He stayed there until Herod died. This fulfilled what the Lord had spoken through the prophet: *I have called my son out of Egypt*.

¹⁶When Herod knew the magi had fooled him, he grew very angry. He sent soldiers to kill all the children in Bethlehem and in all the surrounding territory who were two years old and younger, according to the time that he had learned from the magi. ¹⁷This fulfilled the word spoken through Jeremiah the prophet:

¹⁸ A voice was heard in Ramah, weeping and much grieving. Rachel weeping for her children, and she did not want to be comforted, because they were no more. For everyone born, a place at the table, to live without fear, and simply to be,

Blessing of Homes

Post-Epiphany (January 6, 2022)

In some parts of the world, there is a Christian custom of inviting God's blessing on dwelling places, including both homes and workplaces, and upon all who live, work, or visit there. Along with prayers for God's blessing, the front or main entrance is marked with chalk as a sign and reminder that we have invited God's presence into our homes. This tradition is rooted in the visit of the magi to the place where the Christ-child resided (Matthew 2.1-12), and so it is most appropriately practiced near or during the season after the Epiphany, on January 6.
