Proclamation of the Easter Message—John 20.1-18 (CEB)

20 Early in the morning of the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. ² She ran to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they've put him." ³ Peter and the other disciple left to go to the tomb. ⁴ They were running together, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and was the first to arrive at the tomb. ⁵ Bending down to take a look, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he didn't go in. ⁶ Following him, Simon Peter entered the tomb and saw the linen cloths lying there. ⁷ He also saw the face cloth that had been on Jesus' head. It wasn't with the other clothes but was folded up in its own place. ⁸ Then the other disciple, the one who arrived at the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed. ⁹ They didn't yet understand the scripture that Jesus must rise from the dead. ¹⁰ Then the disciples returned to the place where they were staying.

¹¹ Mary stood outside near the tomb, crying. As she cried, she bent down to look into the tomb. ¹² She saw two angels dressed in white, seated where the body of Jesus had been, one at the head and one at the foot. ¹³ The angels asked her, "Woman, why are you crying?"

She replied, "They have taken away my Lord, and I don't know where they've put him." ¹⁴ As soon as she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she didn't know it was Jesus.

¹⁵ Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you crying? Who are you looking for?"

Thinking he was the gardener, she replied, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him and I will get him."

16 Jesus said to her, "Mary."

She turned and said to him in Aramaic, "Rabbouni" (which means *Teacher*).

¹⁷ Jesus said to her, "Don't hold on to me, for I haven't yet gone up to my Father. Go to my brothers and sisters and tell them, 'I'm going up to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God."

¹⁸ Mary Magdalene left and announced to the disciples, "I've seen the Lord." Then she told them what he said to her.

Scripture Lesson—Acts 10.34-43 (CEB)

³⁴ Peter said, "I really am learning that God doesn't show partiality to one group of people over another. ³⁵ Rather, in every nation, whoever worships him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶ This is the message of peace he sent to the Israelites by proclaiming the good news through

Jesus Christ: He is Lord of all! ³⁷ You know what happened throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism John preached. ³⁸ You know about Jesus of Nazareth, whom God anointed with the Holy Spirit and endowed with power. Jesus traveled around doing good and healing everyone oppressed by the devil because God was with him. ³⁹ We are witnesses of everything he did, both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They killed him by hanging him on a tree, ⁴⁰ but God raised him up on the third day and allowed him to be seen, ⁴¹ not by everyone but by us. We are witnesses whom God chose beforehand, who ate and drank with him after God raised him from the dead. ⁴² He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one whom God appointed as judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³ All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

The Great Thanksgiving

The Risen One be with you. *And also with you.* Lift up your hearts. *We lift them up to the Lord.*

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. *It is right to give our thanks and praise.*

We praise you, God of freedom,

for you breath life into our chaos and form us in your image.

Out of scattered, separated people, you call us together to be your covenant people.

The presence of your glory goes with us into strange and distant lands, gathering from every valley of despair the flesh and blood of living hope.

And so, with the fullness of your new creation, we praise your name on this Easter Day, joining our voices in that unending hymn:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Holy are you, and holy is your Word made flesh in Jesus Christ, in whom you confronted all the powers that kill and oppress, speaking to those considered dead and helping them to live again. Christ taught us to die to self that we might live more fully and freely in and by your grace.

On the night when he gave himself so fully, Jesus gathered with the disciples, took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, and shared it, saying: "Receive, eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this to remember me."

When the supper was over, Jesus took the cup, again gave thanks to you, and gave it to the disciples, saying:

"Drink from this, all of you; this is my life in the new covenant poured out for you and for all for freedom from sin. Do this to remember me."

Though Jesus gave himself away, tortured, betrayed, and abandoned, yet his life could not be confined by our violence or death. In the garden, Christ speaks our name. In the breaking of bread and sharing of a cup, Christ comes to us again. By the lakeside, Christ calls us to continue love's work.

Therefore, with all who have lost faith and with all who have persevered, with the women at the tomb and the men who hid in fear, we confess ourselves surprised again by your resurrection power as we proclaim the mystery of our faith:

Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered in your spirit and on these gifts of bread and wine. *Make them be for us the body and blood of the Risen Christ,* that we may be the body of Christ for all who yearn for new life.

By your Resurrecting Spirit, make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry and mission to all the world until Christ comes again in glory and we feast in communion at your table.

God of newness and mystery, God of wonder and love, God of resurrection and new creation, we praise your name and rejoice in our new life in you. *All honor and glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.*
