

Day of Pentecost

The **Day of Pentecost** (the fiftieth day of the Easter season) represents the third of the three main festivals that give shape to our Christian calendar and Christian lives (alongside Christmas and Easter). Sometimes referred to as the "birthday" of the church, Pentecost celebrates the gift of the Holy Spirit to raise the church out of hiding and out of despair, giving us wind at our back and fire in our bones, empowering us to live the good news of Jesus Christ outwardly and invitationally. Pentecost also begins the long season of the church year we sometimes call "Ordinary Time." "Ordinary," in this sense, comes from "ordinal," meaning that we count the Sundays in reference to Pentecost just as we live our lives in reference to Pentecost, too.

Grow in God's Word

Leader: With disciples of every time and place, let us listen for the word of God among us. **People:** *Our ears and hearts are open.*

First Lesson - Genesis 11.1-9 (CEB)

11 All people on the earth had one language and the same words. ²When they traveled east, they found a valley in the land of Shinar and settled there. ³They said to each other, "Come, let's make bricks and bake them hard." They used bricks for stones and asphalt for mortar. ⁴They said, "Come, let's build for ourselves a city and a tower with its top in the sky, and let's make a name for ourselves so that we won't be dispersed over all the earth."

⁵ Then the LORD came down to see the city and the tower that the humans built. ⁶ And the LORD said, "There is now one people and they all have one language. This is what they have begun to do, and now all that they plan to do will be possible for them. ⁷ Come, let's go down and mix up their language there so they won't understand each other's language." ⁸ Then the LORD dispersed them from there over all of the earth, and they stopped building the city. ⁹ Therefore, it is named Babel, because there the LORD mixed up the language of all the earth; and from there the LORD dispersed them over all the earth.

Second Lesson - Acts 2.1-21 (CEB)

2 When Pentecost Day arrived, they were all together in one place. ²Suddenly a sound from heaven like the howling of a fierce wind filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³ They saw what seemed to be individual flames of fire alighting on each one of them. ⁴ They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages as the Spirit enabled them to speak.

⁵There were pious Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. ⁶When they heard this sound, a crowd gathered. They were mystified because everyone heard them speaking in their native languages. ⁷They were surprised and amazed, saying, "Look, aren't all the people who are speaking Galileans, every one of them? ⁸ How then can each of us hear them speaking in our native language? ⁹Parthians, Medes, and Elamites; as well as residents of Mesopotamia, Judea, and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the regions of Libya bordering Cyrene; and visitors from Rome (both Jews and converts to Judaism), ¹¹Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the mighty works of God in our own languages!" ¹²They were all surprised and bewildered. Some asked each other, "What does this mean?" ¹³ Others jeered at them, saying, "They're full of new wine!"

¹⁴ Peter stood with the other eleven apostles. He raised his voice and declared, "Judeans and everyone living in Jerusalem! Know this! Listen carefully to my words! ¹⁵ These people aren't drunk, as you suspect; after all, it's only nine o'clock in the morning! ¹⁶ Rather, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

¹⁷ In the last days, God says,
I will pour out my Spirit on all people.
Your sons and daughters will prophesy.
Your young will see visions.
Your elders will dream dreams.
¹⁸ Even upon my servants, men and women,
I will pour out my Spirit in those days,
and they will prophesy.
¹⁹ I will cause wonders to occur in the heavens above
and signs on the earth below,
blood and fire and a cloud of smoke.
²⁰ The sun will be changed into darkness,
and the moon will be changed into blood,
before the great and spectacular day of the Lord comes.
²¹ And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ, that we may be the body of Christ, filled with the fire of the Holy Spirit, sent out for the healing of the world.



Our United Methodist Church is a connectional system, meaning, in part, that local congregations are not autonomous or independent but missional outposts of a larger body. That larger body is the "annual conference," which receives its name from the yearly gathering of an equal number of clergy members and lay members who meet together for worship, fellowship, and to conduct the business of the conference (including reporting, adopting goals and budgets, and ordaining clergy members as deacons and elders).

The United Methodist Church of Berea is part of the East Ohio Annual Conference, presided over by Bishop Tracy S. Malone. Under her leadership, our annual conference will meet this year from Thursday, June 9 to Saturday, June 11 at the John S. Knight Center in Akron. Our gathering will be shaped and focused by the theme, "Let Us Live Love," inspired by 1 John 4.7-13. All business sessions, worship services, and celebrations of the annual conference will be livestreamed at <u>www.eocumc.com/eoac22/livestream</u>. Don Moody and Jeff Zeager are lay members of the East Ohio Annual Conference from our congregation and will provide a report to our congregation following this year's session.
