First Lesson - Isaiah 1.1, 10-20 (CEB)

1 The vision about Judah and Jerusalem that Isaiah, Amoz's son, saw in the days of Judah's kings Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah.

- ¹⁰ Hear the LORD's word, you leaders of Sodom.
 - Listen to our God's teaching,
 - people of Gomorrah!
- ¹¹What should I think about all your sacrifices? says the LORD.
- I'm fed up with entirely burned offerings of rams
- and the fat of well-fed beasts.
- I don't want the blood of bulls, lambs, and goats.
- ¹² When you come to appear before me, who asked this from you,
- this trampling of my temple's courts?
- ¹³ Stop bringing worthless offerings. Your incense repulses me.
- New moon, sabbath, and the calling of an assembly—
- I can't stand wickedness with celebration!
- ¹⁴ I hate your new moons and your festivals. They've become a burden that I'm tired of bearing.

¹⁵When you extend your hands, I'll hide my eyes from you. Even when you pray for a long time, I won't listen. Your hands are stained with blood. ¹⁶ Wash! Be clean! Remove your ugly deeds from my sight. Put an end to such evil; ¹⁷ learn to do good. Seek justice: help the oppressed; defend the orphan; plead for the widow. ¹⁸ Come now, and let's settle this, says the LORD. Though your sins are like scarlet, they will be white as snow. If they are red as crimson, they will become like wool. ¹⁹ If you agree and obey, you will eat the best food of the land. ²⁰ But if you refuse and rebel, you will be devoured by the sword. The LORD has said this.

Gospel Lesson - Luke 12.32-40 (CEB)

³² "Don't be afraid, little flock, because your Father delights in giving you the kingdom. ³³ Sell your possessions and give to those in need. Make for yourselves wallets that don't wear out—a treasure in heaven that never runs out. No thief comes near there, and no moth destroys. ³⁴ Where your treasure is, there your heart will be too.

³⁵ "Be dressed for service and keep your lamps lit. ³⁶ Be like people waiting for their master to come home from a wedding celebration, who can immediately open the door for him when he arrives and knocks on the door. ³⁷ Happy are those servants whom the master finds waiting up when he arrives. I assure you that, when he arrives, he will dress himself to serve, seat them at the table as honored guests, and wait on them. ³⁸ Happy are those whom he finds alert, even if he comes at midnight or just before dawn. ³⁹ But know this, if the homeowner had known what time the thief was coming, he wouldn't have allowed his home to be broken into. ⁴⁰ You also must be ready, because the Son of Man is coming at a time when you don't expect him."

New 3-Week Study - Kingdom Dreams, Violent Realities: Reflections on gun violence from Micah 4.1-4 Wednesdays August 3, 10, and 17, 7 PM, Room 13

Throughout our scriptures and our faith tradition, we learn and are reminded that God deplores violence of every kind. Jesus calls us to be peacemakers. Yet the prevalence of guns in our nation makes violence both more deadly and more frequent. Domestic violence becomes more deadly when a gun is present in the home. Rates of suicide are higher in households where guns are accessible. If we hope to end the epidemic of gun violence, we need a cultural shift as well as a policy shift.

The prophet Micah casts a hopeful vision of the future in which nations will "beat their swords into iron plows, and their spears into pruning hooks" (Micah 4.3). In response to this vision, The United Methodist Church urges all "congregations to advocate at the local and national level for laws that prevent or reduce gun violence." As a part of our congregation's faithful response, you are invited to join us for a three-week Bible study prepared by the General Board of Church and Society of The United Methodist Church and based on Micah 4.1-4.
