#### Gospel Lesson - Luke 16.1-13 (CEB)

**16** Jesus also said to the disciples, "A certain rich man heard that his household manager was wasting his estate. <sup>2</sup> He called the manager in and said to him, 'What is this I hear about you? Give me a report of your administration because you can no longer serve as my manager.'

<sup>3</sup> "The household manager said to himself, What will I do now that my master is firing me as his manager? I'm not strong enough to dig and too proud to beg. <sup>4</sup>I know what I'll do so that, when I am removed from my management position, people will welcome me into their houses.

<sup>5</sup> "One by one, the manager sent for each person who owed his master money. He said to the first, 'How much do you owe my master?' <sup>6</sup> He said, 'Nine hundred gallons of olive oil.' The manager said to him, 'Take your contract, sit down quickly, and write four hundred fifty gallons.' <sup>7</sup> Then the manager said to another, 'How much do you owe?' He said, 'One thousand bushels of wheat.' He said, 'Take your contract and write eight hundred.'

<sup>8</sup> "The master commended the dishonest manager because he acted cleverly. People who belong to this world are more clever in dealing with their peers than are people who belong to the light. <sup>9</sup> I tell you, use worldly wealth to make friends for yourselves so that when it's gone, you will be welcomed into the eternal homes.

In a season of political polarization and rising social distrust and division, we are called to relate with one another in a different, more life-giving way. We are called to embody, to practice, and to inhabit the beloved community of God.

During the month of October (five weeks leading up to the next national election, on Tuesday, November 8), we will explore and re-commit to the simple yet profound teaching of the prophet Micah who, in a time not unlike our own, wondered what God required of us and discerned this enduring response: ...to do justice and to love kindness and to walk humbly with God.

By God's grace and through our life together as a community of faith, we are able to love our neighbors and to reclaim these three essential practices. Together, on the five Sundays of October, each of us will be invited to reflect on five themes and to share them with our neighbors:

October 9—Being Kind
October 16—Being Humble
October 23—Loving Your Neighbor
October 30—Where Religion and Politics Meet
