

Leader: With disciples of every time and place, let us listen for the word of God among us.

People: Our ears and hearts are open.

First Lesson - Romans 12.3, 9-18 (CEB)

³ Because of the grace that God gave me, I can say to each one of you: don't think of yourself more highly than you ought to think. Instead, be reasonable since God has measured out a portion of faith to each one of you.

⁹Love should be shown without pretending. Hate evil, and hold on to what is good. ¹⁰Love each other like the members of your family. Be the best at showing honor to each other. ¹¹Don't hesitate to be enthusiastic—be on fire in the Spirit as you serve the Lord! ¹²Be happy in your hope, stand your ground when you're in trouble, and devote yourselves to prayer. ¹³Contribute to the needs of God's people, and welcome strangers into your home. ¹⁴Bless people who harass you—bless and don't curse them. ¹⁵Be happy with those who are happy, and cry with those who are crying. ¹⁶Consider everyone as equal, and don't think that you're better than anyone else. Instead, associate with people who have no status. Don't think that you're so smart. ¹⁷Don't pay back anyone for their evil actions with evil actions, but show respect for what everyone else believes is good.

Gospel Lesson - John 13.3-17 (CEB)

³ Jesus knew the Father had given everything into his hands and that he had come from God and was returning to God. ⁴ So he got up from the table and took off his robes. Picking up a linen towel, he tied it around his waist. ⁵ Then he poured water into a washbasin and began to wash the disciples' feet, drying them with the towel he was wearing. ⁶ When Jesus came to Simon Peter, Peter said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?"

⁷ Jesus replied, "You don't understand what I'm doing now, but you will understand later."

8 "No!" Peter said. "You will never wash my feet!"

Jesus replied, "Unless I wash you, you won't have a place with me."

 $^{\rm 9}\,{\rm Simon}$ Peter said, "Lord, not only my feet but also my hands and my head!"

¹⁰ Jesus responded, "Those who have bathed need only to have their feet washed, because they are completely clean. You disciples are clean, but not every one of you." ¹¹ He knew who would betray him. That's why he said, "Not every one of you is clean."

¹² After he washed the disciples' feet, he put on his robes and returned to his place at the table. He said to them, "Do you know what I've done for you? ¹³ You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and you speak correctly, because I am. ¹⁴ If I, your Lord and teacher, have washed your feet, you too must wash each other's feet. ¹⁵ I have given you an example: Just as I have done, you also must do. ¹⁶ I assure you, servants aren't greater than their master, nor are those who are sent greater than the one who sent them. ¹⁷ Since you know these things, you will be happy if you do them."

Sermon

Celebrating Our Baptismal Covenant

Introduction

Beloved in Christ, through the sacrament of baptism

God's Spirit initiates us into Christ's holy church,

welcomes us into God's saving work, and gives us new birth through water and the Spirit.

All this is God's gift, offered to us freely.

Today, we come to the waters to receive that gift, baptizing this person and renewing our commitments to Christ who has raised us, the Spirit who has birthed us, and the Creator who is making all things new.

Renunciation of Sin and Profession of Faith

On behalf of the whole church, I ask you:

Will you turn away from the powers of sin and death?

We renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness,

reject the evil powers of the world, and repent of our sin.

Will you allow the Spirit to use you as prophets to the powers that be?

We accept the freedom and power God gives us

to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves.

Will you proclaim the gospel and live as Christ's body on earth?

We confess Jesus Christ as our Savior, put our whole trust in grace, and promise to serve Christ as Lord in union with the church which Christ has opened to persons of all ages, nations, and races.

Will you be living witnesses to the gospel, individually and together, wherever you are and in all you do? *We will be faithful members of Christ's holy church*

and serve as Christ's representatives in the world.

Will you nurture one another in living the faith of the church and include this person now before you in your care?

With God's help, we will live the gospel of Jesus Christ.

We will embrace this person in a community of faith, hope, and love,

that they may grow in their trust of God and live Love's service in the world. We will pray for them on their journey of faith among us.

Let us join in professing the Christian faith.

Do you believe in God? We believe in almighty God, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ? We believe in Jesus Christ, God's beloved child, our Lord.

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit? We believe in the Holy Spirit.

I come to you now with my energy running low.


Like the stars in the darkness,
