Lighting the Third Candle on the Advent Wreath

Sometimes on our journey, our feet grow heavy and our shoulders feel burdened.

Sometimes when we're preparing, the busyness overwhelms us,

and we get lost in the doing, the planning, and the running from thing to thing.

And somewhere along the way, we lose our sense of "why."

Why are we doing all of this? Why is this journey and this waiting necessary?

At least part of the reason is the peace: the peace of waiting in God's presence.

We forget that peace when we get so caught up in too many to-do lists.

We forget that peace when we worry more about meeting expectations than connecting with each other.

Our call in this Advent season is to be attentive:

to notice the One who is coming already at work among us.

The third Advent candle is lighted.

We light this candle as a reminder of God's presence:

with us in our waiting, with us in our questioning, with us in our busyness.

Risen Christ, Light of the world, shine in our lies and among us now.
