BLESSING OF HOMES

POST-EPIPHANY (JANUARY 6, 2023)

In some parts of the world, there is a Christian custom of inviting God's blessing on dwelling places, including both homes and workplaces, and upon all who live, work, or visit there. Along with prayers for God's blessing, the front or main entrance is marked with chalk as a sign and reminder that we have invited God's presence into our homes.

This tradition is rooted in the visit of the magi to the place where the Christ-child resided (Matthew 2.1-12), and so it is most appropriately practiced near or during the season after the Epiphany, on January 6.

THE CALLER



You may know, in November someone created an email very similar to Pastor Nathan's and used that email to impersonate him and sent emails asking for Apple gift cards. This was the second time in two years that this has occurred with Pastor Nathan's email. A few months ago, someone did the same thing with Pastor Carrie's email. Impersonating someone to solicit money is illegal.

If you received any of these emails you should block the sender. If you sent any gift cards, and you haven't already done so, you should contact your local police or the FBI. They may be able to help get the money back. The sooner you report any loss, the better chance you have of recovering your money. Once it leaves the country it is very difficult to retrieve.

Retrieving any money sent is only part of the issue in this incident. The other issue is emails were created to impersonate Nathan and Carrie to solicit monthly. If you received any of these emails, you should block the sender and if you haven't already done so, please consider logging the incident with the FBI. They have a link on their website for the form which is titled 'Complaint Referral Form Internet Crime Complaint Center, https://www.ic3.gov. It will be helpful to read through the Frequently Asked Questions to learn all the information you will need to complete the form so you can gather it before you actually begin filling out the form.

If you are 60+ you can also contact the Department of Justice's National Elder Fraud Strike Force. Due to the significant increase in fraud against the elderly, they have increased their staff and created this task force which includes members from their Consumer Protection Branch, FBI, US Postal Inspector and Homeland Security. The telephone number to contact the Strike Force is 833-372-8311. An agent will talk with you to gather the information they need to file an incident.

UPCOMING BOOK DISCUSSION WHOLEHEARTED FAITH BY RACHEL HELD EVANS WITH JEFF CHU

At the time of her death in 2019, at the age of 37, Rachel Held Evans was recognized widely for her theologically astute, profoundly honest, and beautifully personal books which have guided, edified, and helped to shape countless Christians as they seek to live a just and loving faith. *Wholehearted Faith* is the book she was working on at the time of her death; in it, the author wrestles with God's grace and love, looks unsparingly at what the church is and does, and explores universal human questions about becoming and belonging.

FAITH AND PROTEST: THE ROLE OF GOSPEL MUSIC IN MOVEMENTS FOR SOCIAL CHANGE

SUNDAY, JANUARY 15, 10 AM, FELLOWSHIP HALL

Cleveland-based singer/musician Erin Nicole Neal will discuss the history of gospel music from an African American experience and how it had evolved from the age of slavery to the civil rights movement to more modern times. Gospel music influenced culture, and, in particular, its impact on the civil rights movement of the 50s and 60s as activists incorporated freedom songs and protest songs amid the struggle for Civil Rights. The music carried them through marches, jail, demonstrations, and police brutality, as they carried on unabashedly singing, "We Shall Overcome" and "Up Above My Head, I Hear Freedom In The Air" and many more. Erin will demonstrate gospel songs utilized in Civil Rights, as well as Gospel songs throughout its evolving history and discuss why Gospel music was influential in culture and utilized in the Civil Rights struggle.


PASTOR CARRIE IS TAKING SPIRITUAL RENEWAL LEAVE
