
SUNDAY, JULY 2

THE FRONT LAWN (WEATHER-PERMITTING)





We heard a number of updates from across the conference and saw a wide variety of ministries represented, both on the stage and at tables outside of the main conference hall. Hearing how other parishes have adapted to the challenges of declining membership and the growing needs of their communities gave hope and really pushed us to challenge how creative we were willing to get with the resources we have.

Some hard decisions were made at this conference, including the decision to redistrict from ten districts to four (effective January 1, 2024 – and no, we don't know the districts yet), and to approve the disaffiliation of 237 churches from our conference (effective July 1, 2023). But the week ended on a hopeful note: in Bishop Malone's words, we were beseeched to "pull together and let us seize this kairotic moment to seek and live into the new thing that God is doing among us."

Not content to sit in the hard decisions, the conference passed a resolution to write and put forward a statement condemning hate crimes, affirmed the Christmas Covenant forwarded by our beloved family across the globe to start rectifying the effects of colonialism on our denomination, and resolved to condemn Israel's killing of Palestinian children.



We will need: breakfast items (like pop tarts or cereal), lunch items (like individual serve pasta, easy mac, etc.), dinner items (like cup-o-noodles, canned meat, soup, etc.), juice boxes, fruit cups/pouches, and snacks. Keep in mind that easy to prepare or zero-preparation foods make it easier for children. We are preparing at least 100 bags! So the need is great! BROOKDALE ORCHARD VISIT RECAP

It was a warm spring day on June 3, 2023 but under shady trees and tents, six of us from The UMCB, Mittie Imani Jordan from Brookdale Orchard (brookdaleorchard.com) and from St. Matthew UMC as well as two additional ladies from St. Matthew UMC, and six people from Next Step Ministries learned about Underground Railroad Codes of Freedom and painted them on fence pickets.


Did you know that one of the Codes of Freedom, called Crossroads, represents Cleveland, Ohio? People from The UMCB donated ten perennial plants and eight annual plants to the mission. The group also got a tour of three plots of land that are part of Brookdale Orchard and learned more about the purpose of the Orchard – turning vacant land in the neighborhood into growth opportunities – growth of food and job opportunities – and a way to build a peaceful community.
