

We Grow in God's Word

Leader: With disciples of every time and place, let us listen for the word of God among us. **People:** *Our ears and hearts are open.*

First Lesson— Psalm 119.129-136 (NRSVUE)

- Your decrees are wonderful; therefore my soul keeps them.
- The unfolding of your words gives light; it imparts understanding to the simple.
- With open mouth I pant, because I long for your commandments.
- Turn to me and be gracious to me, as is your custom toward those who love your name.
- Keep my steps steady according to your promise, and never let iniquity have dominion over me.
- Redeem me from human oppression, that I may keep your precepts.
- Make your face shine upon your servant, and teach me your statutes.
- 136 My eyes shed streams of tears because your law is not kept.

Gospel Lesson — Matthew 13.31-33, 44-52 (*NRSVUE*)

³¹He put before them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in his field; ³² it is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches."

³³He told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour until all of it was leavened." ⁴⁴ "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which a man found and reburied; then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field.

⁴⁵ "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; ⁴⁶ on finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it.

⁴⁷ "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net that was thrown into the sea and caught fish of every kind; ⁴⁸ when it was full, they drew it ashore, sat down, and put the good into baskets but threw out the bad. ⁴⁹ So it will be at the end of the age. The angels will come out and separate the evil from the righteous ⁵⁰ and throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

⁵¹ "Have you understood all this?" They answered, "Yes." ⁵² And he said to them, "Therefore every scribe who has become a disciple in the kingdom of heaven is like the master of a household who brings out of his treasure what is new and what is old."
